ave you ever thought what it was like to be next to Jesus while he lived on earth? Being there to witness his miracles and listen to his sermons. The hear the reaction of the crowds to the awesome power with which Jesus ministered. To observe Jesus in prayer as He and the Father conversed. To be close to Jesus would give us an insight into who He was, what He believed and how His lifestyle witnessed to who He was and to His mission. While we cannot be physically close to Jesus as Peter, Andrew, and all the Apostles were, prayerfully reading and meditating on the Scriptures affords us the opportunity to "come and see" Jesus' life and ministry. In prayer, God draws close to us in an encounter that feels like God is siting right in front of us, conversing with us about life and faith.

When Jesus invited the two disciples to "come and see," he was inviting them to investigate who he was and what his life and ministry was all about. Jesus' invitation was the opportunity that the two needed to discover whether or not Jesus' life and mission was for their lives as well. St. John tells as that Andrew followed Jesus from the invitation to "come and see". Discerning a vocation to the consecrated life entails

both praying for clarity of the divine call, as well as the opportunity to learn about the life and mission of the community being discerned. An important, even necessary aspect of discernment is to "come and see" with the community."Come and see" in discernment can entail any and all of the following: prayer and meals with the community, regular conversations with the vocation director, on-line discernment sessions, and moments of living with the community-overnight stays, retreats and longer periods of residence with the community, and possible ministry experience as well. Such moments afford a discerner the important opportunity to discover the community's life and mission from personal, first-hand participation. When purchasing a new home appliance or an automobile, one investigates the item thorough internet searches or by speaking with persons who have the same item. The investigation into a desired item is essential to knowing whether or not the item is what is needed and desired. "Come and see" moments are essential in the discernment process. The experience of praying, living and working with a community of consecrated religious, the discerner gains valuable knowledge to

further clarify if the possibility of joining this community is the right fit for growing in discipleship with the Lord lesus. Visits to the community allows the discernment process to take-on a human element. The discerner gets to know the community through the life stories and ministry experiences of the professed members. These interactions exemplify the written materials shared by the community in the discernment process. In these moments, the discerner gains a richer, deeply understanding of the community's charism through its' members. In discernment, praying, reading vocation literature, and visits with the community are key elements to the process.
